

DRESS CODE

The Board of Education's Policy on Dress and Grooming-

“It is the purpose of the Board in the matter of pupil grooming to enhance the health and safety of the students and to avoid distractions to the educational process. The Board has authorized the Superintendent to enforce school regulations prohibiting student dress or grooming practices which:

- a. present a hazard to the health or safety of the student him/herself or to others in the school i.e. flip flops, backless sandals, platform shoes pose a threat to safety;
- b. materially interfere with school work, create disorder, or disrupt the educational program i.e. the midriff section should be covered, shorts should be fingertip length, no indecent, vulgar offensive writing on clothing, no pajamas.
- c. cause excessive wear or damage to school property i.e. cleats, spikes, roller skate type shoes, chains
- d. prevent the student from achieving his/her own educational objectives because of blocked vision or restricted movement i.e. strapless tops or shirts with less than a 1 inch sleeve.”
- e. head covering is not permitted, i.e. hats, caps, visors, sweatbands, sunglasses, bandannas.
