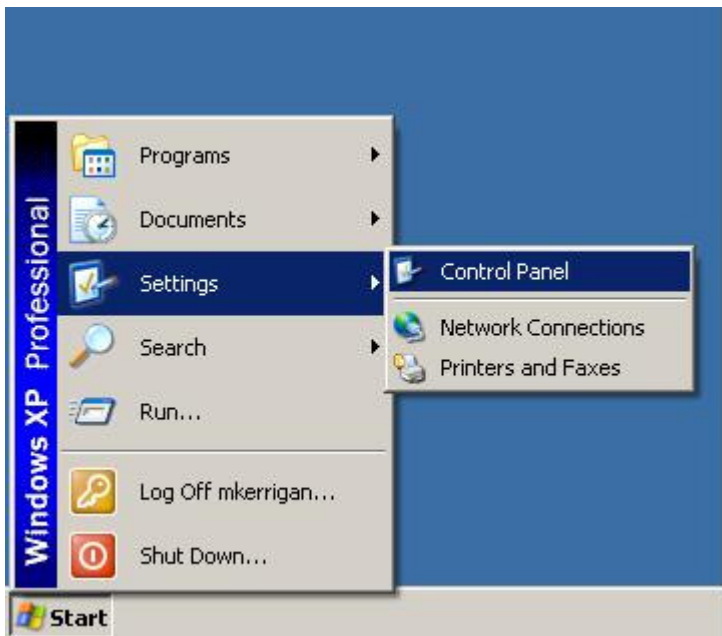


There are physical requirements to PowerDVD functioning properly. The computer you wish to play a DVD must have a DVD Player or a DVD Read Write Burner / Player. A CD ROM drive will not work. How can you tell? Well look at the cover of the physical CD/DVD Drive there is writing on the tray (typically) which indicates the type of drive. It is hard to see as it is just molded plastic and does not stand out.

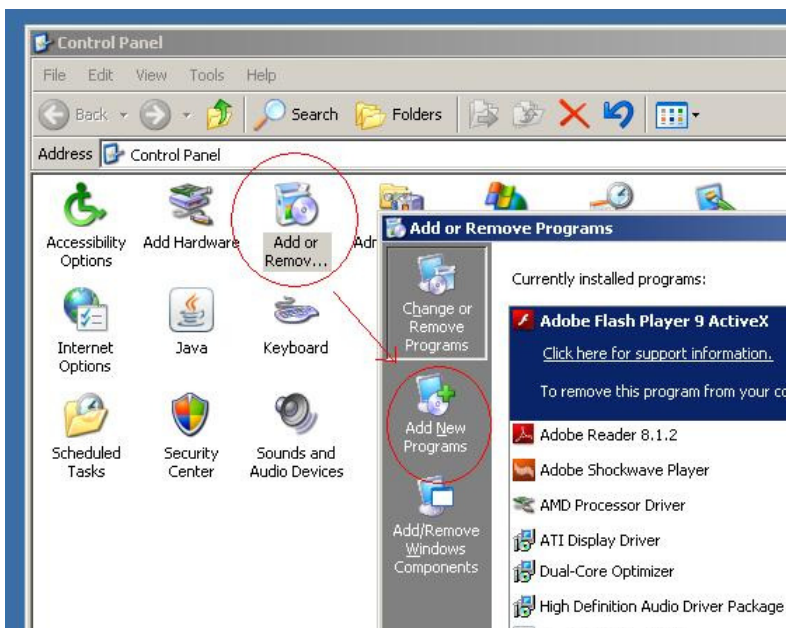
If it says 'Compact Disc' then it is a CD ROM drive and will not play DVDs. Others may say 'Compact Disc / Rewritable' and 'DVD Player' and this is fine it is a CD Burner with DVD Player built-in. Whatever the case your computer must have a DVD Player.

To install PowerDVD software follow the instructions below.

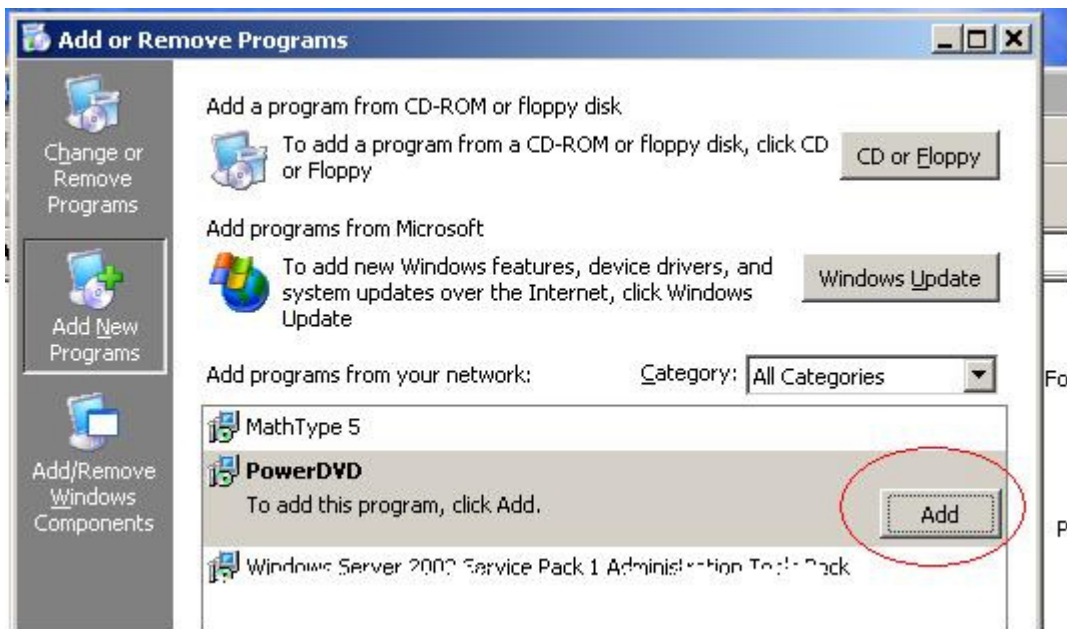
1. Open the Control Panel and Select Add/Remove Programs from the list of options.



Once in Add/Remove Programs select the option on the left side to 'Add New Programs'



The resultant box will display software that is available to you. One of the options will be PowerDVD. Click the Add button to the right (see below).



The product should automatically install and once done you will need to logout and log back in for the icon / shortcut to appear in your 'My Applications' folder.

As a best practice to view DVD's have your computer turned on and logged in, then insert your DVD into the DVD drive. A menu will pop up and you can select 'PowerDVD' from the menu. There is an option to remember your selection and if you check this subsequent DVD plays will automatically launch this application without asking you.
